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## Champions of azeroth contract

Contracts are a new type of item that was added in the Battle for Azeroth expansion pack. These are basically on-use consumables that gives you a permanent buff. This means you only need to buy one to get the effect for your character, but you will of course need to buy a new one if you want to change. When you have the buff from having used a Contract, you will get 10 extra reputation with the chosen faction each time you complete a World Quest. It can be absolutely any level 120 World Quest (so no use going back to the Broken Isles), so it's a nice way to farm rep with a specific faction without having to wait for their World Quests to pop up. It's still very slow though, since you need to do 100 WQs for only 1,000 rep. Each contract is tied to one of the Battle for Azeroth factions, and all of them (except for 7th Legion for Alliance, and The Honorbound for Horde) has a Contract for their faction. This leaves us with the following 8 Contracts: Contract: Champions of AzerothContract: Tortollan Seekers Contract: Proudmoore AdmiraltyContract: Order of EmbersContract: Storm's Wake Contract: Zandalari EmpireContract: Talanji's ExpeditionContract: Voldunai You need Inscription BfA level 95 for Rank 1, 105 for Rank 2, and 115 for Rank 3 to create any of the reputation contracts. It's a nice way to level up Inscription, since this is likely to be an item that will be valuable and sell a lot. To create any of the contracts, you need the following items: Rank 1: 18 Ultramarine Ink + 10 Crimson InkRank 2: 15 Ultramarine Ink + 8 Crimson InkRank 3: 12 Ultramarine Ink + 5 Crimson Ink WoWMay 8, 2019 4:00 pm CT in patch 8.2, we'll finally be able to fly — and that includes the new zones we'll be going to. We just need to complete the second half of Battle for Azeroth Pathfinder. It's not nearly as intensive as the first part of the achievement, but it will still take a bit to complete. The devs said they're using Legion's Pathfinder as a model for Battle for Azeroth, so we can expect the requirements and progress to be similar. Community interviews revealed reputation requirements and the devs estimate that it should take players 2-3 weeks after the patch releases to earn the reputation needed to be able to fly. Here is what you need for part two of Pathfinder: If you're not yet caught up on the first part of Battle for Azeroth Pathfinder, you still have a couple months before patch 8.2 is likely to come out. To check your personal progress, Wowhead has a nifty Flying Tracker. Here is what you'll need for part one of Pathfinder: The questing and exploring part of the achievement is the easy part. Even the War Campaign is easy because it consists of more questing. The real gating here is the reputation. Completing the Loremaster achievements and story lines will net you a good chunk of the initial reputation. After that, World Quests are your main source of steady reputation gains, along with reputation rewards from the mission table. You can apply a weekly contract for your choice of faction that will give you extra rep from all Battle for Azeroth World Quests. Emissaries award 1500 rep each, and Faction Assaults award 500 rep for 7th Legion/The Honorbound and 500 rep for the zone they're located in. Island Expeditions have a small chance to drop quest items you can turn in for 250 rep. Most of them can also be purchased for 100 Seafarer's Dubloon each (except for the faction insignias). There are also a couple ways to boost your reputation gains. The Darkmoon Faire is up for the first week of every month (starting the first Sunday) and you can get a 10% rep increase by riding the carousel or roller coaster for the WHEE! buff, or by using a consumable Darkmoon Top Hat. The buffs last for an hour, but the Top Hat and Whee buffs don't stack. Every 7 weeks, the World Quest Bonus Event is up, which grants a passive Sign of the Emissary buff that increases World Quest reputation gains by 50%. When you complete all this, you can fly! Flying will be enabled in all outdoor zones in Battle for Azeroth, including Nazjatar and Mechagon. And to top it off, we also get a new mount for completing the pathfinder achievements: Wonderwing 2.0. Champions of Azerth is an Alliance and Horde reputation added in Battle for Azeroth, reaching revered is required for Part 1 of Battle for Azeroth Pathfinder. This faction is one of the most important factions for those who seek character progression. Reaching friendly, honored, revered will give you a quest that will increase your Heart of Azeroth item level by 15, and a final +10 item level after these rewards. These rewards are account wide, meaning if you earn it with one of your character, all characters can use these upgrades. Rewards Quartermaster of this Reputation is Magni Bronzebeard, and can be found in Silithus (42, 44). Taking silithus portal from Dazar'alor or Bolarus will take take you to him. Friendly Reaching Friendly will award you with a Heart of Azeroth +15 Item level increase. You also need to be friendly with Champions of Azeroth in order to use Contract: Champions of Azeroth. Honored Drape of the Azerothian Champion Armor (Back) 1,100 Reaching Honored will award you with a Heart of Azeroth +15 Item level increase. Revered Hitting revered is required for Part 1 of Battle for Azeroth Pathfinder. Reaching Revered will also award you with a Heart of Azeroth +15 item level increase. Exalted Paragon After reaching exalted, you can still work toward Paragon chest. After gaining 10,000 reputation you will be rewarded with a chest containing items and currencies. How to get reputation Quick MODE Doing World Quests Emissaries Mission tables Contract: Champions of Azeroth Detailed MODE Like Tortollan Seekers, Champions of Azeroth is not associated with any maps. Unlike Tortollan Seekers, Champions of Azeroth does not have any quest that you can do right away. All of its quests are locked behind an event, for example your Heart of Azeroth reaching level 55. The main source of your reputation gain with this faction will be World Quests and Emissaries. Sometimes World Quests give bonus reputation, instead of normal rewards which is very good to reach revered. You need to do the quest Uniting Kul Tiras (Alliance) or Uniting Zandalar (Horde) to unlock World Quests. Each Champion of Azeroth World Quest gives 75 reputation, and sometimes even more with bonus rewards. You can know what repuiton a world quest gives by looking under its name. 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
