Rothenburg ob der Tauber and the romantic road "A The beautiful historic city known for its half-timbered houses and pebble-cobblestones follow the cobbled roads through the fairytale gate embusted within the city walls and a step forward in a medieval Europe. This is one More beautiful cities located along the famous "Romantic Road" in Bavaria, an attraction that also deserves a place in this list. The road is a picturesque Rott From 350 km through the forests and the mountains of Bavaria and Baden-Württemberg. Rothenburg, although small, is full of interesting sites; The market square flanked by the 14th century buildings, the Tower of the High Town Hall which has 241 steps leading to one of the most beautiful views of the city and the interesting crime and medieval punishment. When the night does not fall, don't miss the fun tour of the Night Watchman! Beautiful Rothenburg ob der Tauber captured on the film "The black forest - dense evergreen forests and picturesque villages and a famous beauty point in Germany a land of cuckoo watches and Cherry Gâteaux, this place is so beautiful and magical has even inspired some of the Brothers Grimm Fairy Tales. Covers a vast area within which you will find the spa town of Baden-Baden (otherwise known as the Nera forest "Jewel"), Friborg (a vibrant university city) and Offenburg (the capital of the region of wine) and many other beautiful rather characteristic German villages. However, the most attractive part of this area can be viewed by driving or excursions along the Schwarzwaldhochstraße - a fantastic high road where you can travel through the gentle hills and Vaili, dense forests of black fir trees and lakes covered with fog. One of the most beautiful lakes in the area is Titisee, try to capture the Zapfen-Bahnle train alone the panoramic road of the lake or follow the lake road where you can take the "Tranquil water" beauty. 3. Neuschwanstein Castle - Fable castle that is one of the most famous places to visit in Germany This extraordinary iconic image of Germany is, in fact, the former century of the 19th century Laddi Ludwig II of Bavaria (otherwise known as Mad King!) The wonderful Romanesque building is so fairytale that inspired the famous castle Although it is often invaded by tourists, this does not diminish the impressed beauty of this castle both either and out. The most picturesque view of the magnificent structure is from Ponte di Maria, a stop halfway up the hill towards the castle. Make sure to pay also a visit to the beautiful Hohenschwangau castle which is located nearby. 4. Lake Königssee - one of the most beautiful lakes in Germany and one of the best places to explore in the country Located in the southeastern part of Germany and on the border with Austria, is the beautiful Lake Königssee - the deepest and cleanest lake in Germany. It is also often hailed as the most beautiful alpine lake in Germany, which given the competition is a nice pair! Bavaria is a particularly scenic place to visit in Germany and this corner of the region has been used for outdoor recreation for centuries - both Bavarian royalty and the local rulers of Berchtesgaden and Salzburg once driven out here. In line with its pure and natural environment, only electrically powered passenger ships, rowing, and pedal boats have been allowed on the lake since 1909. 5. Regensburg - a Bavarian city on the Danube River known for its well-preserved medieval architecture UNESCO World Heritage sites are remarkably rare but Regensburg, Germany has managed to get the attention of the organization. In 2006 Regensburg became a UNESCO World Heritage Site for the pleasure of its residence 150,000. Strolling through the streets of this beautiful city will bring you face to face with some of the most spectacular architecture in the world. If you are attracted to water, you will love Regensburg as the city is perched along the Danube, Regen and Naab rivers. This alone would have many clamorous to get into town for a holiday, but it is the charm of Regensburg that brings visitors back again and again. 6. Sanssouci Castle - its park and breathtaking park are a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a must-see view in Germany Located near Potsdam, in East Germany, this large summer palace sits on a large hill. Created for Frederick the Great of Prussia, it is said to resemble the Palace of Versailles mostly because of the exquisite terraced gardens planted so as to cascade beautifully down the slope of the hill. Inside the gardens are secluded temples and gazabo and the palace itself is embellished with gilded Rococo details and 18th century furnishings. 7. Bamberg - a picturesque city sometimes called "the Rome of Germany" Located in Bavaria, near the River Main, is the beautiful historic city of Bamberg. Its historic center is so overflowing with important architecture that it has earned a UNESCO World Heritage status. Explore the narrow cobbled streets of the old town, the elegant 13th-century cathedral and the town hall on a bridge over the River Regnitz. Stroll along the streams and then stop for a glass of local beer in one of the many outdoor beer gardens. 8. The Valley of the - a beautiful alpine ice valley that is one of the most beautiful places to explore in The Rhine valley is easily one of the most beautiful places to visit in Germany. The rhine of the extraordinary river crosses the slate mountains of income, skewing among the castles of the hill, the tilted fields of grapes that produce wine, churches gothic, forest hills, wooded hills, chargy cliffs and idyllic villages full of semi-timber villages . Excursion through the path of the valley for a spectacular view of mountains, castles, mineral springs and small countryside inns. The Bingen area in Koblenz is a UNESCO World Heritage site and is home to a disconcerting forty castles and stately houses. 9. Bremen - a picturesque town notes for its extraordinary Anseatic buildings, Bremen is an anxiety city in north-western Germany. Sits set along the Weser river and the small compact city is one of the oldest in Germany, dating back to 1200 years. In the oldest part of the city (the Schnoor-Viertel area) make sure to explore the delightful cobbledsteed alleys of winding side by side by a series of charming medieval houses that are equipped with facades with beams in a
