Types of voucher in auditing

Any publicly listed company in the U.S. is required to have its financial statements audited. This process improves internal controls and assesses a company's performance. Finance leaders need to understand the different types of audit reports so they can make confident decisions and optimize their processes. The main types of audit reports are unmodified opinion reports, qualified opinions, adverse opinions and disclaimers. Unmodified opinion reports are given when the auditors are able to access all the data they need in the proper formats. Qualified opinions are given when there are parts of financial records missing or not conforming to the proper standards. Adverse opinions are made when the company's financial situation as a whole is unreliable or unconfirmed. Disclaimers are made when the auditor isn't able to finish the report. Each type of audit report has a distinctive role and provides valuable insights into your company's financial performance. An audit report is an official evaluation of an entity's financial status, combined with the auditor's opinions and collected data on the entity's financial transactions and situation. This is a common process for companies to use when examining their own records and releasing financial information to investors or potential investors. Audits may occur within or outside of the company in question. An internal audit is performed by accountants who work inside the company. These audits are usually easier to perform and do not take as long since the auditors are familiar with company records and have experience in making reports. However, investors and official agencies do not have the same trust in internal audits, and many companies do not have the resources to perform them, so external audits are also practiced. In this case, a company will hire a firm to perform audits on its behalf. There are four distinct types of audits that can be produced, whether internal or external. The unmodified opinion report is the purest type of auditing report. It is unmodified by any caveats the accountant writing the report may have, meaning that they have been able to access all needed financial information and that the information was in conformity with GAAP (generally accepted accounting procedures). This makes it much easier for the accountant to perform the audit, but there are several qualifications the auditors are required to mention, such as whether other accountants besides the writer worked on the audit or whether there are concerns about the company's financial status. A qualified opinion report is given when the auditors were not able to fully satisfy themselves on all aspects of the company's financial status. Specific records may be missing, or some parts of information may not be up to GAAP. In some cases, the auditor may be able to access data but not fully confirm it. All these problems are documented and make the auditor's evaluation more negative. An adverse opinion report is a negative response that occurs only when the auditor finds the company's records as a whole are uninformative and not in line with GAAP, or if the financial records have been falsified or are in other ways erroneous. The accountants add paragraphs explaining these problems and giving their opinions as to how the records differ from GAAP. The disclaimer report is issued only when the auditors are unable to perform their work. When not enough time or information is available, a disclaimer of opinion report is issued. This is rare. An auditor will often only make this report if the company refuses to reveal specific information or if the auditing firm and the company break their contract. There are other influences auditors must consider when making their report, usually concerning the state of the company. If the company is being investigated for a specific crime, or if it is expected to be sold or dissolved within the next year, the auditors take this into consideration and alter their report because of it. Audit preparation and planning makes an audit go smoothly. Even if the company underwent an audit last year, the issues this year may be different. Audit planning and control make it easier to answer the questions that worry small business owners the most. The first step in planning an audit is for the auditor and client to discuss the client's concerns. Once the auditor understands the issues, they'll draw up a list of documentation required for the audit, research the problems and identify the steps to get the answers. Then the audit begins. Audit preparation and planning matters because business owners want the audit to be as quick and painless as possible. The auditor can conduct the investigation more efficiently if they make some audit planning notes: What are the risk areas? Is the owner concerned about fraud in the financial statement or that someone on staff is stealing assets? What steps does the auditor need to take answer the client's questions? Are the auditor and the client on the same page about the audit, no misunderstandings? How much is the audit going to cost? Part of the importance of audit planning is that by saving time, it saves the business money. Among the questions to discuss before the auditor begins the prep work: Why did the business owner decide to make an audit? What risks does the owner most want to address? How will this audit advance the company's goals? What documentation does the auditor need to do the job? If, say, the business owner is concerned about purchase fraud, the auditor needs details about the procedure, such as who makes purchases and who approves payment. Once the auditor has answers to the initial questions, they can start their preparations. Learning the business. If the auditor's not familiar with the specific processes the owners wants them to look at, they should research it. That involves reading the documentation, meeting the individuals involved and become familiar with the company's procedures. Establishing lines of communication. If the client has questions or wants reassurance, they need to know how to get hold of the auditor. If the auditor needs more information, they should have a contact at the business ready to help them. Taking some walkthroughs. The auditor should visit the business and see how things run. Do people actually follow the procedures that protect against internal theft and fraud? Are any key documents or files left available to people who shouldn't have access? Going into detail about the client's worries. If the owner has multiple concerns, the auditor must identify the ones that represent the priority risks. They should look at the procedures the company uses to minimize risk and see if there are any obvious vulnerabilities. If the auditor needs more information, they shouldn't hesitate to ask for it. The company should already have controls in place for reducing the risk of error or fraud. The auditor will study the controls until they're familiar with them and what they do. Is a given control meant to prevent risk or to detect a problem? Are controls performed constantly, daily, weekly or what? Is the control software-based or performed by people? The auditor can then decide the best way to test the controls: watching the work, inspecting documentation or independently performing the process themselves. If the auditor's working with a new client, the audit preparation may require some added information. How trustworthy is the business owner? An auditor has a duty not only to the client but to anyone looking at the client's finances, such as investors. If the client has a rep for shady dealings, the auditor must be careful not to sign off on them. Is the client financially sound? If they're flirting with bankruptcy and might duck payment, does the auditor want to take on this project? Does their former auditor have any advice to offer? If it's an old client, it's important the auditor not to make assumptions about the job. Things may have changed since the last audit. The auditor should be aware of the changes and adapt their plan accordingly. You can start an auditing business with a minimal investment, often by working from your home on nights and weekends until you build a customer base. Some kinds of auditing only require intelligence and a bachelor's degree, or equivalent work experience. Other auditing areas require specialized training, but all auditors should be detail-oriented, have strong organization skills and work well independently. Choose from the four basic types of outside auditing services that most organizations recognize: financial, compliance, operational and information technology. Subcategories include medical coding, which takes extensive training, energy auditing, health and safety checks, OSHA compliance, EPA monitoring and regulatory compliance auditing. Choose your specialty, assess your skills, study the market and get certifications and training as needed for the auditing specialty you plan to offer. Professional certifications, testimonials and transparent backgrounds are important when you're asking people to trust you with confidential information and the financial details of a business. If you plan to offer financial auditing, CPA accreditation is required by most states. If you plan to conduct energy audits, accounting and Certified Professional Environmental Auditor certifications will make your service more attractive to business clients. Other certifications include Certified Internal Auditor, Certified Information Systems Auditor, Certified Fraud Examiner and Certification in Control Self-Assessment.
