Bridalveil creek group and horse camp

This campground is reserved for the folks -- and their pups -- who have a little ruggedness and adventure in mind for their camping outings. This equestrian area is a primitive campground situated within Central California's Sierra Nevada Mountain Range. With an elevation of about 7,200 feet and a location about 26 miles away from Yosemite Valley, this secluded campground isn't for the faint of heart! Ensure that you, your pup, and your crew are well-versed in wilderness safety before staying at this campground. You'll be able to choose from an equestrian site or a family site, but know that you're only allowed to reserve a horse site if you have a horse with you. As neat as this is, you don't have to have a horse to enjoy these absolutely stunning views -- simply look to snag a family campground site (not an equestrian site). These sites are all first-come, first-served, so be sure to get there early!As far as amenities go, each campsite features a picnic table, a fire ring, and a food storage locker (because in this area you need to be incredibly bear-aware!). The campground has flush toilets (a luxury for a primitive site like this), drinking water, and even parking spurs for the horses. The surrounding area is truly the reason to visit this campground. On every side, you'll see giant sequoias, vast wilderness, granite cliffs, waterfalls, and valleys. There are truly endless opportunities for hiking, exploring, and adventuring, but keep in mind that pups aren't allowed on many of the trails in Yosemite -- it's best to look up the routes before you go. If you choose to bring your pup along, know that there's no listed leash policy. That being said, you're in bear country, and if your pup isn't strictly off-leash trained with voice commands, it's likely best to keep your dog on their leash at all times for safety purposes. Bridalveil Creek Campground is located on the road to Glacier Point in Yosemite National Park, California. This campground has 110 individual campsites along with a horse camp and group camp area. For 2019 the campground will be on a first come first serve basis. The water system was damaged this winter so the park service has brought in handwashing stations and porta-potties for each loop of the campground. Pets Allowed: Pets are allowed but they must be on a leash less than 6 feet long. Pets are not allowed inside park buildings or on specific trails. Horse sites available by phone reservation only by calling 877-444-6777; online reservations are not accepted for horse sites Group sites - Required and available online up to five months in advance from approximately July through early September. Campground Amenities Flush Toilets: No flush toilets during the 2019 season. There are outhouses and handwashing stations in each loop Potable Water? No, Creek water may be available for boiling or filtering, but campers should be advised to bring their own water. The Glacier Point gift shop is planning to stock extra water. You may want to bring one of these Foldable Water Storage Jugs with you. They are easy to transport in the car and fill with water before you reach the campground. Payphone: No Is wifi available? Campground Regulations The maximum number of people in a campsite: A maximum of six people (including children) are allowed per campsite. There is no limit on the number of tents (as long as they all fit into the campsite). The number of cars per campsite: Two motorized vehicles per campsite. A valid campground car pass must be displayed. Checkout time: 12 noon Quiet Hours: Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 6 am Maximum Stay: 7-day maximum stay limit. There are 13 campgrounds in Yosemite National Park. Four of the campgrounds are in Yosemite Valley, five of them are along the Tioga Pass and Tuolumne Meadows which are open seasonally, the rest are found along Highways 120 and 140. Located on the Glacier Point Road, off of the Wawona Road (CA-41), about 45 minutes south of Yosemite Valley, at 7,200 ft (2,200 m). Bridalveil Creek Campground contains 110 campsites with tent and RV space. Each campsite contains a fire ring, picnic table, and food storage locker 33"(D)x45"(W)x18"(H), and is near a bathroom with potable water and flushing toilets. Dump station: Wawona (on Forest Drive east of the Wawona Store) and Yosemite Valley (in Upper Pines Campground). Groceries: Yosemite Valley (limited groceries available in Wawona). Pets: Permitted (except in the group sites). Showers laundromat: Yosemite Valley (at Curry Village and Housekeeping Camp). Open: July through early September (approximately). Reservations: No. All sites are on a first-come, first-served basis. Cost: \$14/night for each campsite (maximum 6 people per site). Group Camp Same as above, except pets are not permitted. The campground contains two group campsites. Reservations: Required and available online July through early September. Cost: \$40/night for each campsite (13-30 people per site). Horse Camp Same as above. The campground contains three stock sites. Reservations: Required and available online July through early September.
