If you suffer from a mouth ulcer, the most likely cause is a wound inside your mouth - for example, "biting the inside of your cheek, rough fillings, a sharp tooth or a cut from eating hard food or drinking a hot drink", explains Romama Kuchai, ENT consultant surgeon for BUPA UK. If you are one of the unfortunate individuals who suffers from these uncomfortable places on a regular basis, there may also be an underlying factor." It's not always clear what causes regular mouth ulcers, but stress, anxiety and eating certain foods - such as chocolate, spicy foods and peanuts - can trigger them to come back", explains Kuchai. "Hormonal changes and stress can also be triggered. Your genes can also play a part, as frequent mouth ulcers can be performed in families." If your mouth ulcer is around, or you are suffering from frequent periods of mouth egging, it could be that there are other factors at play. "Some oral ulcers are the result of an underlying systemic condition such as viral infection (cold pain virus, hand, foot and mouth, for example), or celiac disease. In addition, they can be a side effect of some drugs such as ibuprofen or beta-blockers", explains Vikas Malik, ENT surgeon consultant at Pall Mall Medical.Finally, mouth ulcers can be "more prominent and severe" if you are immunocompromised - for example, those who are seropositive chemotherapy, malnourished or undergoing chemotherapy", explains Malik.The good news is that most mouth ulcers clear themselves and won't last more than a week or so. To relieve pain and inflammation during this period, it is worth asking your pharmacist to recommend a topical gel or ointment to speed up the long healing process. However, if your mouth ulcer is around for over three weeks, or you're experiencing them on a normal basis, it may indicate an infection or other underlying problem and it's worth looking for medical advice. "If your mouth ulcer lasts longer than three weeks and it's painful or bleeding, you should look for advice", Kuchai explains. "In some cases, a long-lasting ulcer can be a sign of oral cancer, so it's important to get it checked." When it comes to looking for advice, should the dentist or doctor be our first port of call? "We would always recommend going to the first degree dentist", advises Dr. Nigel Carter, CEO of the Health Oral Foundation. "However, if you are not able to visit the dentist, your GP will be able to help. If there is a problem or need to refer you, refer both to the same place - oral surgery or oral pathology. "It is worth keeping in mind that if you have other symptoms, a doctor is often the most appropriate healthcare professional to look for- example, lack of iron, vitamin b12 or folic acid are associated with mouth ulcers, although relatively uncommon. In such cases, you may have other symptoms of anemia, such as fatigue, feeling faint or getting easily breathless, mouth ulcersBe even a symptom of celiac disease, which can lead to the belly of pain, wind, swelling and diarrhea and fatigue and fatigue. When it is possible that a persistent mouth ulcer could be a cancer sign, it is important to remember that this condition is relatively rare. "Mouth cancer is relatively rare," explains Kuchai. "Only two in every 100 tumors diagnosed in the UK are mouth cancer." "However, if you have had an ulcer for your mouth for more than three weeks, you should check if it is still, bleeding, or has a rolled edge. If you have one of these symptoms, it's important to show it. The doctor You can recommend a mouth or throat exam to check for cancer control. "" It is also important to look for any unusual red or white patches in the mouth, especially if they are changing shapes, "Recommend Carter. "Even if you develop lumps in the mouth area or any persistent pain, it is important to look for a medical advice. In all probability, it will be nothing serious, but better is sure you sorry." "There are some simple lifestyle changes you can adopt to reduce the risk of mouth cancer," explains Kuchai. "These include the search for any changes in your mouth and making them check, visiting your dentist for regular check-ups and drink alcohol only in moderation. Do not smoke and protect the skin from sunlight, it can also help." Finally, keeping yourself healthy can ward off viruses that can cause ulcers, and can help reduce the risk of cancer. Usually it is due to an infection that affects the transparent front surface of the eye, resulting in inflammation of the cornea (keratite). Contact eye eye eye eye ethat can lead to a corneal ulcer. contact lenses can rub on the surface of the eye, causing slight damage to the epithelium that can allow bacteria to penetrate into the eye. If you wear contact lenses, you can increase the chances of avoiding corneal ulcer by doing good hygiene, such as washing your hands before handling the lenses and following other safety tips. In addition to bacterial infections, other causes of corneal ulcer are fungi and parasites, such as: Fusarium, these mushrooms were associated with fungal keratite outbreaks among contact lens wearers. acanthamoeba. These common parasites can enter the eye and cause acanthamoeba keratitis. It is a very serious eye infection that can cause permanent scars of cornea and loss of sight. the microorganisms of the acanthamoeba are located in the water of the tap, in the pools, in the whirlpools and in other water sources. Wearing contact lenses during swimming greatly increases the risk of corneal ulcer caused by the acanthamoeba keratin. Other causes of corneal ulcers include: treatment of corneal ulcers is suspected of having a corneal ulcer, immediately consult an ophthalmologist. The untreated corneal ulcer can lead to a serious loss of sight and also of the eye. The treatment of corneal ulcer usually includes frequent application of topical antibiotics. The location and size of the corneal ulcer will guide the ophthalmologist to determine the need for crops to identify the type of organism involved. most ophthalmologists visit patients with corneal ulcers every one or three days, depending on the severity of the condition. If the ulcer is in the central cornea, the condition usually takes more time to heal. There is also a greater risk of loss of sight from a central corneal ulcer. Eye trauma increases the risk of a horny ulcer from fungal keratin, this is particularly true when organic matter (as from a branch of a tree) is involved in injury. treatment of corneal ulcers from fungal keratin includes the use of anti-fungal agents. these can be used topically for the eye and by mouth, depending on the severity of the ulceration. prognosis for a good vision depends on the extent of the infection.
